1. The setting is where or when the story takes place. Describe the setting of where or when that story takes place. Remember to use details to support your answer.

2. Characters are people in stories. The most important person in the story is the main character. Character traits show what a person is like and offers clues to a person's behavior or actions. Describe what that character is like using clues from the story that tell about the main character's behavior and actions.

3. Plot is the main plan or pattern of events in a story. The turning point is when an event happens that lets the reader know something is about to change. The climax of the story comes at the end, when the details come together and form a resolution. Tell when you began to realize that the story was starting to come together.
