

Emotional Awareness Every month our school mental health professionals push into classrooms to teach and practice a social-emotional skill. This month all grades will be focusing on emotional awareness. Not only will we be identifying our own emotions, we will be attempting to identify others' feelings and discuss how they affect our own behavior.

#### HOW THIS HELPS IN THE CLASSROOM

Your kids are bombarded by emotions every day at school- theirs, their teachers, and their friends. If they know how they are feeling and are aware of others' emotions, they can appropriately adjust their behavior to avoid melt downs, conflicts with friends, and disruption in learning. # THINGS TO TRY AT HOME!!!

As parents, we are very aware of our kiddo's feelings. When they are grumpy or moody, we are asking ourselves, "Are they tired? Are they hungry? Did they have a challenging day at school?" And then we adjust our behavior to theirs. But do they ever do the same for us? There are many days when we are tired or frustrated or sad. Are our children aware? Do they adjust their behavior because of ours? It is okay to tell them how you are feeling and ask or help them adjust their behavior. This teaches emotional awareness as well as empathy, compassion, and kindness. Those are all qualities we want our kiddos to have, and not always easy to teach. Real life gives you the scenarios you need to practice emotional awareness every day.
